



How to get to Maastricht?

Travel by foot?

- Assuming you are leaving from the **main train station**, do the following:
- Walk out of the train station, you should now be standing with taxis on your left and buses on your right.
- Skip the taxis and buses, and walk straight on, going down a street with two separate car lanes.
- After about 400 meter you will come to a bridge. Cross it.
- On the other side of the bridge, go left and continue in that direction. Stay close to the water.
- After about 400 meter, with the river on your left and a park on your right, you will find the hostel.

Travel by car?

Oh the joys of a car. Check <http://maps.google.com/> on how to get there. There are some parking spaces nearby, but be aware that parking tariffs in the Netherlands can be quite expensive.

Travel by bus?

The lovely Eurolines bus company has a stop in Maastricht. Its exact location is [here](#). If there is no bus going to the Maastricht stop, we recommend Eindhoven or Den Bosch as alternative stops for your journey. Eurolines buses are very cheap and environmentally friendly. They have launched an European website, <http://www.eurolines.eu>. A good site to start your journey.

Travel by boat?

Forget it. There are no boats going to Maastricht, as it is not (yet) close to open water. Put your faith in climate change and come back in 30 years. Then it will be Maastricht by the sea.

Travel by train?

There are many international (and national) train connections to and from Maastricht. If you want to check all available connections, we highly recommend www.db.de. Currently available in 9 different languages! Of course for the actual booking you are usually better off with your own train agency. If you are coming by train, please book as soon as possible (it is cheaper then) and don't forget additional saving options (e.g. you are below 26, you are travelling together etc.).

If arriving by airplane and you need to travel to Maastricht by train, please keep on reading!

Travel by airplane?

Well airplanes are dirty, inefficient and dangerous, but cheap. And we need you to go cheap. So yes go ahead, get yourself an airplane. Just plant a tree somewhere later and we will be very happy.

Maastricht is surrounded by many airports (we have no idea how they stay in business). Some of these fly low-cost carriers, so it worth checking out their own websites for booking:

Brussels Charleroi airport

Travel from Charleroi airport is done by taking bus to Charleroi Sud, and then 2 hour train ride.

Cologne Bonn Airport

Train travel takes about 3 hours, you will have to switch about 3 times.

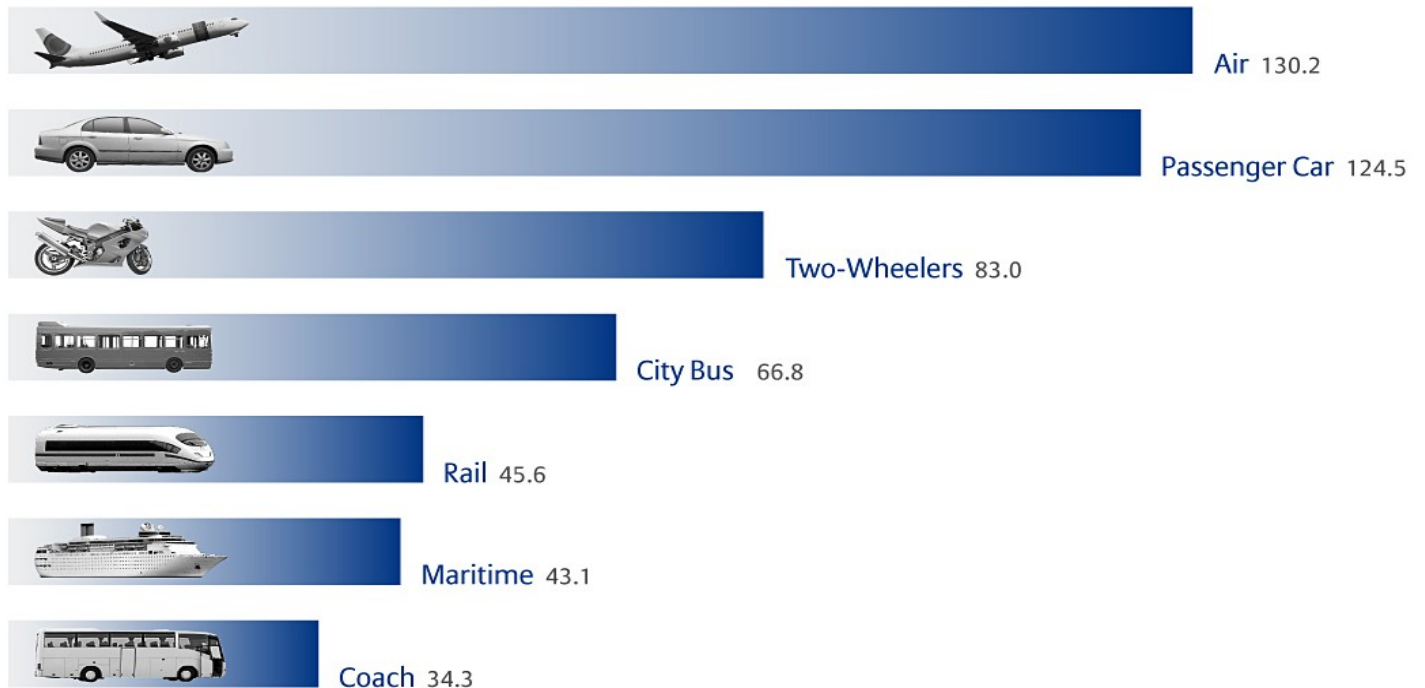
It might sound silly, but trains in Netherlands are very expensive so therefore choose your airport carefully. Below you can find the prices for most common journeys, when buying the ticket at the counter.

All connections and price are for back and forth

- Brussels - Maastricht: Below 25 years old 16 EUR, Over 25 years old 24 EUR
- Weeze - Maastricht: 60 EUR (bus to Kevelaer (DE), then train to Maastricht)
- Liege - Maastricht: Below 25 years old 4 EUR, Over 25 years old 6 EUR
- Eindhoven - Maastricht: For everybody 15 EUR
- Cologne Airport - Maastricht: About 60 EUR
